General Assembly of Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) will hold Biennial Meeting

The 219th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is gathering in Minneapolis from July 3–10 for its biennial meeting. At this year's meeting, the GA will be considering and voting on several very important issues which could have a profound impact on our denomination. As part of worship services this past weekend, Bill Marsh, an FPC Bethlehem Elder and one of four delegates to the GA from the Lehigh Presbytery, shared in depth about these issues. He also explained the process our Presbytery and our church will follow in response to any action of the GA.
