On Sunday, November 14, 1875, twenty-one people gathered in the parlor of the Bethlehem YMCA for an inaugural worship service. Four elders were elected and ordained, the group celebrated the Lord's Supper together, and First Presbyterian Church, Bethlehem was born. While they couldn't have known what might unfold going forward, their dream for the fledgling congregation was surely *A Future with Hope*.

We, too, share that hope-filled vision for this congregation's future even if we can't yet imagine exactly what it looks like. As we reflect on FPCB's past and present, we can't help but see the pattern of God's faithfulness and guidance even through the most difficult seasons of life and ministry together!
